MEETING MINUTES

Review and Approval of Meeting Minutes from 7/27/2023: 1st Sam Bulkilvish, 2nd Jim Galvin. Approved.

BUSINESS

Review Draft Population Projections

Ed presented the Draft 2023 DPC Projections, and said the major changes are based on Census Bureau projections for 2021 and 2022. They show Net Migration around 40,000 for the State, mostly in Sussex County. A graph of Net Migration by Year shows in Sussex County around 2021-2022 a large rise and drop, followed by a long-term slow rise. Ed emphasized that Migration affects other aspects of population including births, deaths, and racial structure. A graph of Natural Increase by Year shows a long-term future decline in every county.

Ed continued to see problems with Census data, including a reported overcount of around 50,000 persons in Delaware and tension between groups within the Census. But we may have to live with the current Net Migration numbers, unless data changes in 2023 and 2024. A table of Projections by Age Structure shows for New Castle County a big future increase in the older population and a future decline in younger age groups. In the other counties, the table shows future growth more evenly distributed among age groups. A table of Projections by Race/Ethnicity Structure shows the biggest growth in the Hispanic population, and the white population is going negative in New Castle County and Statewide.

The tables of Municipal population show Middletown leading growth in New Castle County. Growth in Kent County is focused around Dover and Smyrna. Much growth is shown in Sussex, especially the western part of the county. Colton questioned the projected growth in Millsboro, due to potential infrastructure issues. Jim asked why the population of Kent County is static. Ed responded that New Castle County has had big companies build their economy and Sussex has attracted retirees, while Kent depends on government. Ed mentioned factors that could affect population numbers including pandemic, real estate issues, and medical advances. Anson asked about second homes in Sussex County, and Ed discussed retirements in that area. Dawn asked why the population of Dover dipped around 2020-2024, and Ed responded that occupancy of group quarters including colleges may have affected the numbers.

OTHER BUSINESS

Sam announced a State Planning meeting later that day with a Census representative to discuss Demographic and Housing Characteristics file A, and invited others to attend.

FUTURE MEETING DATES

Matt announced that voting on the final demographic projections would occur at the next meeting on October 26th, as well as election of the Chair and Secretary for next year.

ADJOURNMENT

The meeting was adjourned at 10:50 AM.
